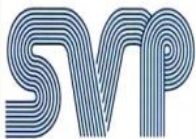

St. John Henry Newman (1801-1890) was baptized in the Anglican church. He was ordained an Anglican priest. In 1845, he felt called to convert to the Catholic faith and spent the last 40 years of his life as a parish priest in Birmingham, caring for the poor. His writings have had a major impact, including in the Second Vatican Council. He got a hard time from bishops in Ireland and England. The prayer which he gave us, led him though. That kindly light will lead us too, if we ask.

Lead Thou me on;
The night is dark, and I am far from home,
Lead Thou me on;
Keep Thou my feet; I do not ask to see the distant scene,

The 2019 Synod for the pan-Amazon

region continues until next Sunday. Pope Francis has called bishops, indigenous leaders, and other experts to address the cultural, ecological and religious issues facing the Amazon region of about 34 million inhabitants, including three million indigenous people from nearly 400 ethnic groups. The synod faces challenges; however, the opposition is from some church officials outside the Amazon region. We all need to pray for the guidance of God's Spirit on the synod and on the critics.
